

Dear Parishioners,

This past week has been a whirlwind! On Tuesday, I spent two hours at Holy Family Primary School visiting every classroom for Catholic Education Week. I gave blessings, answered questions, and—let me tell you—our young students know how to keep a priest on his toes!

One child asked, "Who created God?" A theological heavyweight for a Tuesday morning! Another wanted to know if I have another job (I suppose they think being a priest is part-time!). And then, a very practical one: "Who waters your plants?" (A fair question—sometimes I forget myself!). These adorable yet profound inquiries were delightful, though I must admit, tackling them on an empty stomach was a challenge. By the end of it, I had a newfound appreciation for our teachers, who manage to keep up this level of engagement all day, every day. Hats off to them!

On Wednesday, our Year 4 students from both the school and parish celebrated their First Reconciliation. It was a beautiful experience, and what was even more encouraging was seeing many parents and adults also taking the opportunity to receive the sacrament. A reminder that God's mercy is for all of us—young and old alike!

This week, I also celebrated two funerals, one at each parish—Jordanville and Mt Waverley. We continue to pray for the souls of the departed and for their families in this time of grief. May they find comfort in God's promise of eternal life. On Saturday, I will celebrate a Memorial Mass, another moment to pray for and remember our loved ones.

This weekend, we will welcome our catechumens and candidates for the First Scrutiny at 10 a.m. Mass at Holy Family. This is a significant step in their journey to the Catholic faith, and as a parish, we accompany them with our prayers and support.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus speak of repentance, using the parable of the barren fig tree (Luke 13:1-9). At first glance, the fig tree seems doomed—it has borne no fruit for three years. The natural reaction would be to cut it down. But the gardener (who we can see as a figure of Christ) pleads for one more year, promising to care for it, to nurture it, and to give it another chance to bear fruit.

How often do we feel like that fig tree—unproductive, struggling, or spiritually stagnant? The good news is that Jesus, our Divine Gardener, never gives up on us! He patiently nurtures, prunes, and nourishes us with His grace, always giving us the opportunity to grow and flourish. This Lent, we are invited to open our hearts, allow God to work in us, and make real changes in our lives. Maybe that means letting go of old habits, reconciling with someone, or simply deepening our relationship with Christ.

So, if you've been feeling a bit like a barren fig tree lately—don't worry. God hasn't given up on you, and neither have we!




