### INTRODUCTORY RITES

*The absolution by the Priest follows:*

and bring us to everlasting life.

At the Saviour's command  
and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

*Together with the people, he continues:*

thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread,  
and forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.

*The Priest alone continues, saying:*

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,  
graciously grant peace in our days,  
that, by the help of your mercy,  
we may be always free from sin  
and safe from all distress,  
as we await the blessed hope  
and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

*The people conclude the prayer, acclaiming:*

For the kingdom,  
the power and the glory are yours  
now and for ever.

*The Priest alone continues, saying:*

Let us take a moment for quiet prayer, placing before our Lord our needs and intentions at this time.

*After some time for quiet prayer the priests and people together pray*

My Jesus,  
I believe that You  
are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.  
I love You above all things,  
and I desire to receive You into my soul.  
Since I cannot at this moment  
receive You sacramentally,  
come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite  
myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You.  
Amen.

## BLESSING

*The Priest alone continues, saying:*

Father of might and power,  
every good and perfect gift  
comes down to us from you.  
Implant in our hearts the love of your name,  
increase our zeal for your service,  
nourish what is good in us  
and tend it with watchful care.  
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,  
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, for ever and ever.
